

Dentists condemn failure on HPV vaccinations
(News from the British Dental Association)

Dentists have condemned news that the Joint Committee on Vaccination and Immunisation (JCVI) has decided not to recommend an extension of the Human Papilloma Virus (HPV) vaccination to school age boys.

BDA Chair Mick Armstrong said: "HPV has emerged as the leading cause of oropharyngeal cancers, so JCVI's unwillingness to expand the vaccination programme to boys is frankly indefensible. The state has a responsibility to offer all our children the best possible defence. "Dentists are on the front line in the battle against oral cancer, a condition with heart-breaking and life-changing results. Ministers can chose to sit this one out, or show they really believe in prevention."

HPV Action is asking members of the public, especially the parents of boys, to sign an online petition demanding gender-neutral vaccination, see www.hpvaction.org.

The British Dental Health Foundation provides this information about vaccines for boys: You can currently give boys the same level of protection as girls by getting a HPV vaccination from your pharmacy. Boots currently charges £300 for vaccinations for boys aged 12-14 and £450 for 15-year olds and over. It is wise to speak to your doctor before making a decision to have boys vaccinated. As it stands 95% of dentists support a gender-neutral HPV vaccination, as do 90% of GPs, with the majority of these willing to pay to have their own family members vaccinated.
